FOLLOWING PLANNING APPLICATION PA16/05846 and PA15/08068 WORKS TO THE TREES AT POLYPHANT GREEN ARE NOW TAKING PLACE.

THE HORSE CHESTNUT TREES UNFORTUNATELY HAD HONEY FUNGUS WHICH WAS OVER 1 METRE DEEP FROM THE ROOTS AND HAD TO BE FELLED FOR SAFETY REASONS.

THE DESCRIPTION OF WORKS ARE ATTACHED.

FOLLOWING WORKS TO THE TREES WE HAVE BEEN AWARDED A GRANT FROM THE WOODLAND TRUST FOR REPLANTING.

THE LOGS ON FELLING WILL REMAIN STACKED ON THE GREEN DURING THE WINTER TO PROVIDE HABITAT FOR WILDLIFE.

T2 ROWAN

Removal due to mechanical damage

T12 COPPER BEECHS

Weed and mulch within 1 metre diameter circle of stem. Remove stems that are rubbing by 1 metre in total. Would like to replant these two with new specimens close to them and when large enough remove the current two.

- G11 **Sycamore hedge** reduce height by 1.5 metres in order to introduce light to play area.
- T71 ACER coppice and mulch within 1 metre diameter circle of stem.
- T76 ASH remove ivy and mulch within 1 metre diameter circle of stem.
- T59 **SWEET CHESTNUT** removal of ivy and mulch within 1 metre diameter circle of stem.
- T47 TULIP TREE weed and mulch within 1 metre diameter circle of stem
- T6 **LIME** as T47.
- T1 **BEECH** as T47.
- T11 **HAWTHORN** as T47
- G5 **SYCAMORE** remove and treat stumps.
- T14 **BEECH** remove ivy and mulch within 1 metre diameter circle of stem.

We would also like a quote for pot-hole filling to the paths around the village green.
