Christmas Tree

The tree came from humble beginnings, the first few years relied on Mark donating trees which was quite simple since they were located over the road and our small team of helpers dragged the tree over the hedge. We also borrowed David's patio lights. The Church has always been supportive and has allowed us to use their electrical supply. When Mark's trees dried up we needed a new source, luckily for us Caroline stepped up to the plate. The trees from Trebartha came with a set of new obstacles, they were quite a lot bigger and of course a few miles away. Our team of volunteers needed a new dynamic which came in the form of NRS transport. Nick has provided the transport for the trees and also a lot of entertainment. As the trees grew in size we needed to address the lights, we have tried many types of lights but the most successful ones have been the linkable LED type in use at the moment, this has allowed the lights to increase in numbers to 1600 Amps. As always the focus has been to raise money for Charity, this year we are collecting for "Little Harbour" Children's hospice South West. Trekelland Bridge

Trekelland Bridge has been hit again by a passing vehicle and quite likely this will lead to a road closure for it to be repaired in February. I have arranged for a meeting to be set up with Cormac's Principle Engineer for Structure and Maintenance with the Chairman of Lewannick and South Petherwin Parish Councils to try and find a way forward to provide a long term solution to prevent this from happening. It has been proposed to build a new bridge beside the old bridge for the traffic and keep the old bridge for pedestrians and cyclists, the major stumbling block is raising the finances for this scheme.
