PARISH COUNCIL

Lewannick Parish Council met on Tuesday 16th April in Lewannick village Hall.

Councillor Parsons. Adrian's full report is available on his official Facebook page.

Planning, PA24/02149 land adjacent to Glebelands change of use of a traditional stone rural building to a dwelling house. This was supported by the Council.

Dog Bins and notice boards. It has been reported that the Old Hill dog bin has not been emptied, the clerk is chasing this. New notice boards have been placed in Polyphant and Lewannick.

Polyphant Green- Two no parking signs have been placed on the Green to help protect the wildflowers. Bosvena Health have placed signs in the surgery to remind patients not to park on the green as there is adequate parking provided. Bees trees have removed a fallen tree and four dead Elms. It has been requested that a wooden hitching rail be placed outside of the shop to allow riders to visit the shop, the Parish Council thought that this was a good idea and are awaiting notification as to what it would look like. Highways- Cllr Parsons reported that there is a meeting planned to discuss the Plusha Junction and National Highways is supposedly coming forward with significant funding for the project. The missing directional sign at example Cross will hopefully be replaced post April 2024. Parish Clock- There has been damage to the parish clock, as you will have noticed. The missing hand will need to be repaired at an estimated cost of £3868 + VAT for the repair, if the old hand is used. The Clerk has reported this incident to the Police.
